

A Visit From Norfolk Accident Rescue Service On Tuesday 18th July 2017

We had a fantastic time on Tuesday when NARS brought some of their vehicles to school for the Reception children to learn about and explore. NARS is an organisation that provides expert help at the scenes of serious road accidents and other emergencies. We split each class in to three and each group had an area to explore; we rotated around so everyone had an opportunity to receive the full NARS experience. One group learned how to do chest compressions on Annie the training dummy. They also had the opportunity to press the start / stop button on the Lucas Machine, which is a fantastic chest compression system that emergency responders use. This group also had the opportunity to try on some of the uniforms that NARS volunteers wear. The second group explored an emergency response vehicle. They enjoyed letting off the siren and climbing all over it discovering the wide range of equipment that they need to carry with them. The last group investigated an ambulance; climbing inside both the front and the back. It was a fantastic experience for the children ... and adults! Children in Years 1 and 2 also got to come over and share in the opportunity. All of the NARS staff are volunteers and the charity is run purely through donations so we were very pleased to be able to raise some money for them with a non-uniform day.
