Weekly Newsletter 21.01.2022

Dear Drayton Families,

As you may be aware, we have seen a significant rise in positive Covid-19 cases across the school. As expected, cases are now being seen across the school and are rising sharply. This is being seen across the county, particularly with primary age children where regular testing for early identification is not advised.

We have notified the Outbreak Management Team due to meeting a threshold as detailed in our contingency plan. They have looked through the measures we have in place to try to prevent further outbreaks and have advised us that no further action is required at this time. While we continue to reduce contacts for staff and children in school, regularly clean high tough points, ask staff to test twice weekly and promote and supervise hand hygiene we are aware contacts outside of school are beyond our control.

Thankfully, from what we have been told, those who are currently isolating are well and not experiencing severe symptoms. While isolating and testing can be extremely disruptive to families, we strongly urge parents to ensure they are vigilant of any symptoms and test where appropriate. The most common symptoms currently being experienced in young children is a sore throat and/or tummy ache/upset stomach. There is a rising number of children and adults who are testing positive, following a positive result in the autumn term due to the new variant. This again is common across the county.

We have seen an increase in staff testing positive which is heavily impacting on capacity in school. While we have cover plans in place for Monday, we are aware these may change over the weekend if more staff test positive. To ensure we can remain open and provide an education for the children, we may need to merge classes and/or move staff around.

We will continue to monitor the situation, ensuring we have safe levels of staffing for supervision, first aid and cleaning. If we are required to close classes, we will give as much notice as possible.

DUE TO RISING CASES THE OUTBREAK MANAGEMENT TEAM HAVE PROVIDED FURTHER GUIDANCE THIS AFTERNOON. THEY ARE NOW ADVISING THAT ALL KS1 CHILDREN LFD TEST DAILY FOR THE NEXT 7 DAYS (OR UNTIL THE CURRENT WAVE HAS PASSED). PLEASE SUPPORT US IN TESTING YOUR CHILD DAILY SO WE CAN KEEP ALL CLASSES OPEN TO THE CHILDREN.

Learning taking place in our classes this week!










This week, we have continued to think about our book "The Everywhere Bear" by Julia Donaldson. Each class has their own class bear and we voted for a name for them. The bears have continued to set challenges for us around the classrooms and the outside area. The class bears will also be coming home "virtually" this week. We will be asking the children to keep diaries to let us know what the children have been doing at home. To help us with this, we have been practising writing recounts in class. We have also been practising writing in sentences and using our phonemes to sound out words we know. We are all looking forward to seeing where the bear goes first and what we find out about where we live. We also practised using adjectives to describe Everywhere bear and our class bears.

In maths this week, we have continued to think about parts of numbers before adding them back together to make the whole. We have also been thinking about the word "equal" and making sets that are equal to each other. We have also been practicing using positional language to think about where our bears might be and went on an outside bear hunt, where we kept a tally chart to find out how many we had.

We also started a new unit of dance in PE. We practised making our own standing "poses"! The children were brilliant at this and remembered to use all their poses when they came to the disco too! It was great fun and we can't wait to do some more dancing next week. Please remember our PE day is TUESDAY for all three classes and children should come to school in their PE kit for the day.







The Emperor's Egg by Martin Jenkins is our new Power of Reading book that we will be reading during literacy. This week, we have been learning all about verbs to describe how Penguins move. We used verbs to create our own poems.



In maths, we have reading, writing and interpreting mathematical statements including addition. We have been challenging ourselves to add 1-digit numbers to 2-digit numbers using concrete and pictorial representations.

This week in art, we have been colour mixing with paint to create different shades of blue. We have painted our artwork in the style of Nery's Levy. In History, we have been finding out all about Robert Scott Falcon and Roald Amundsen's expeditions to Antarctica.



In maths we have been exploring number bonds to and within 20. We have learnt that when we add two odd numbers they equal an even number, two even numbers added together equal an even number, and an odd and even number added together equal an odd number. We have looked at patterns within number bonds to help us use a system to find all possibilities. We have learnt that addition and subtraction are inverse calculations and used this to help us solve missing number problems.
