Dear Drayton Families,

It's been a challenging week in school (and at home for many too) but the children continue to amaze us with their resilience to the changes they've faced. The staff have continued to pull together to cover colleagues who have been unwell and/or self-isolating and have done everything they can to make things as smooth for the children.

Thank you for your continued patience and understanding.

With cases of Covid-19 still high in school we are continuing to recommend daily LFD testing for children. The staff are continuing to test daily and wear face coverings in communal areas. While wearing a face covering is not mandatory on the school site (outside), we kindly ask you to wear one if you need to speak with a member of staff, to ensure we are doing everything we can to slow the spread and keep all classes open. With many staff not having had the virus, particularly the current variant, it is still highly likely staffing and classes will be impacted in the coming weeks. We will continue to update you as soon as we can.

As well as Covid-19, we are seeing an increasing number of sickness cases. While this can be a common symptom with young children who have Covid-19 this isn't always the case. Please could we ask that you continue to be vigilant and even if your child is not positive, you keep them off school until they are well enough to attend (at least 48 hours from the last bout of illness).

Learning taking place in our classes this week!



This week we have continued our learning all about The Everywhere Bear. We have been sharing where our class bears have been and looking at a map to help us to find the locations. We have been exploring how he might feel on his journey through drama and role play. We have made story maps to record the bears journey and retell the story too. We have continued writing sentences to help us with this.



In maths, we have been taking photographs of small groups with our "maths eyes" and using this to think about part and wholes of 4 and 5 again. This time we have been representing the number using different objects. We have started to think about recording these with number sentences. Can you remember any of the pairs of numbers that add up to 5? We have been using number tracks to help us use the language of more and fewer to compare numbers.




We have had lots of fun making our own maps. We have used words such as on, next to, under, behind etc to describe where we need to go next. We have also been exploring designing, making and evaluating a boat for the Everywhere Bear to travel on. We wonder where he will go next?





In Literacy, we turned ourselves into weather reporters. We worked in groups to create scripts using present and future tense to describe the weather in Antartica and then acted this out. In maths, we have been reading, writing and interpreting subtraction sentences. We have been subtracting 1-digit from 1-digit and 2-digit numbers. Additionally, we have challenged ourselves to find the missing number in problems such as 7 - ? = 2.





This week in Science, we have carried out an experiment to explain which conditions melt the ice the quickest and the slowest. Additionally, as part of the RSPB bird watch, we went outside to look for birds and discussed the importance of looking after wildlife.



In maths we have been recognising and finding fractions of shapes. We have consolidated one whole, one half, one quarter and one third. Our new learning has focussed on 2 quarters and three quarters.
